

## Erin Rothstein

Erin Rothstein ist eine kanadische Künstlerin. Sie wurde in Montreal geboren und lebt und arbeitet in Toronto. Ihre jüngste Serie „The Tasting Room“ stellt Rothsteins unvergleichliche Signatur der hyperrealistischen Malerei von essbaren Gegenständen auf minimalistischem Hintergrund zur Schau. „Ich male Lebensmittel, weil ich alles liebe was mit Esskultur zu tun hat“, erklärt Rothstein. „Oft esse und koche ich und bin dabei völlig versunken in die kulinarische Erfahrung von Gerüchen. Geschmäckern und dieser Ästhetik. Die Lebensmittel, die ich male, sind universell zuordbar. Sie lösen die Emotionen der Menschen auf einer sehr ursprünglichen Ebene aus und machen ihn glücklich, hungrig, aufgeregt und manchmal auch nostalgisch.“



Rothstein hat einen neuen Raum für den Hyperrealismus im Kontext des heutigen Kunstmarktes geschaffen. Ihre Kunst kombiniert akademische Technik mit innovativen Sujets und Kompositionen, wodurch sie den Hyperrealismus als einen neckischen und frischen Stil präsentiert. Rothstein führt Essen und Kunst näher zueinander und fördert eine neue Wertschätzung der Kunst in einer zunehmend eindringenden Schlemmerkultur.



Rothstein hat einen BFA der *Concordia Universität*, wo sie sich auf die Malerei und das Zeichnen spezialisierte. Sie hat einen MA der *Universität von Western Ontario*, wo sie die Evolution des Dekorativen in der Modernen Kunst studierte. Die „The Tasting Room“ Serie wurde mit der *Scotiabank Zuschauer-Wahl Auszeichnung* bedacht und bekam zudem die Unterstützung des *Ontario Arts Council*. Auch in der *Huffington Post*, *The National Post*, *Architectural Digest* und *Toronto Life* erhielt die Serie Anerkennung. Rothsteins Kunst ist in grossen Kollektionen enthalten, unter anderem bei *Google* und *The Colart Collection*. Ihre interdisziplinäre Erfahrung in der Kunst und ihr entschlossener Einsatz für eine zeitgenössische Ästhetik führen sie zu Projekten, die hochgradig nuanciert und erfrischend innovativ sind.

## Erin Rothstein

Canadian painter Erin Rothstein was born in Montreal, and later moved to Toronto. In her latest series, "The Tasting Room", Rothstein uses her signature hyperrealist style to portray edible subjects on minimalist backgrounds.

"I paint food because I love everything that has to do with food-culture," Rothstein explains. "You'll often find me cooking and eating, all the while engrossed in a total culinary experience of smells, tastes, and aesthetics. The foods I paint are universally relatable. They trigger people's emotions on a very primal level, making them happy, hungry, excited, and nostalgic."



Rothstein has been carving out a new space for hyperrealism within the context of today's art market. Her work combines academic techniques with innovative subjects and compositions, in order to showcase hyperrealism with a whimsical and fresh-faced style. Rothstein brings art and food closer together, fostering a new appreciation of art in an immersive foodie-culture.



The artist holds a BFA from Concordia University where she specialized in painting and drawing. She also holds an MA from The University of Western Ontario, where she studied in detail the evolution of décor in modern art. "The Tasting Room" series has received a Scotiabank Viewer's Choice Award, as well as support from the Ontario Arts Council. This series has also received recognition in The Huffington Post, The National Post, Architectural Digest and Toronto Life.

Rothstein's work is held in major collections including Google and The Colart Collection. Her interdisciplinary experience in the arts and fierce commitment to the realm

of contemporary aesthetics lends itself to projects that are highly nuanced and refreshingly innovative.
